CHRIST THE KING DEAF CHURCH WEST CHESTER, PENNSYLVANIA

Christ the King Deaf Church (West Chester, PA) has had a busy season.

• November 25, DeafCAN! had a Thanksgiving celebration for their RIA group (Refugees, Immigrants, and Asylees) at CTK, Philadelphia. 28 people attended from eight countries (Brazil, Cambodia, Colombia, Iraq, Liberia, the Philippines, United States, and Ukraine). Our guest was state representative Joseph Hohenstein who is hard of hearing and married to an ASL interpreter. He was previously an immigration lawyer. A Deaf Palestinian/Israeli woman passed her naturalization test in early December and a Colombian man will take his test in mid December.

- On Christ the King Sunday, November 26, CTK welcomed nine more new members. In 2023, 14 new people joined CTK.
- CTK celebrated with an Advent service and Christmas luncheon on December 10. This included an in-person raffle and a Silent Auction online to help fund DeafCAN! services. Some items included an autographed Phillies cap, a framed autographed Eagles photo, Starbucks ASL mugs, Deaf art by national Deaf artist Nancy Rourke, and hand-knit shawls.
- CTK plans to celebrate their Christmas Eve Eve worship at 7 p.m. December 23 followed by a dessert reception. A traditional favorite is "Silent Night."
- DeafCAN! will host their DeafBlind holiday party on December 30 with SSPs and some family members along with state SSP services, StepUp.
- Finally, CTK will welcome the new year with an Epiphany prayer service and potluck brunch on January 7.
