of the first house where we replaced the bathroom floor. I also took some time to help paint when opportunities arose.

Greetings to each of you as we begin the fall season! I have to admit it is my favorite time of the year. Canadian geese stop by as they begin flying south. The university across from my church fills up with students who fill our town and force us to drive very carefully. I will not mention football!

I just returned from some productive ELDA Board meetings in Rapid City, South Dakota, where we stayed at the beautiful and spiritual Terra Sancta retreat center where our 2024 ELDA Conference will take place next year. We were awed by the rooms, the view, the food, and the staff. The Committee from Heartland Ephphatha Ministries (HEM) have done a good job planning for a wonderful event and won our approval. We will be able to visit Mt. Rushmore monument and Crazy Horse Memorial in the Black Hills. More surprises are planned! We were joined by six-month old Makenzi who kept us in good spirits during many hours of work.

Speaking at the Smithsonian Institute Folklife Festival in Washington, DC for several days in July was a highlight of my summer. I met so many interesting people including a group of Ukrainian singers, native Americans who shared their stories, Ozark craftspeople, and more! Our CTK group also visited the Deaf-owned Mozzeria pizza restaurant and Deaf Starbucks, plus fascinating museum displays between workshops. You can find an online workshop of me and deaf Rabbi Darby Leigh discussing Deaf Ministry and another workshop with three women discussing female leadership in communities of faith.

I was also able to lead the "God-time" of two different week-long summer camps in Maryland and Pennsylvania for special needs Deaf adults hosted by the United Methodists. We focused on Moses and the 10 Commandments and what that means for us today. The campers did some awesome dramas. In between the two camps, I journeyed to BOLD to support them during their decisions to sell their beloved church building and decide between two other churches to become their new home base. SAY HER NAME: MAKAYLEN JAYMES



On September 8th, 2023 my precious little 18 month-old great-niece did not wake up from her sleep. It was a shock and very heartbreaking to everyone in my family. Makaylen Jaymes was the youngest member of our large family. She was the granddaughter of my sister, Rhonda/Steve and the daughter of my niece, Mallory/Adam and a little sister to Aliyah who is 4.5 years old. The days following her death were a blur while her parents planned her funeral.

My only job during that time was to support my sister as she described how she found Makaylen that fateful morning and also to line up an interpreter, I chose Melissa, a long time friend of mine who is also one of 2 interpreters at the Bethel Lutheran Church in Rochester, Melissa also is an interpreter for plays and different dramas.

The celebration of Makaylen's life was shown in pictures; hundreds of them lined up the room, along with Makaylen's artwork, her favorite toys, and a video that showed the different phases of her very short life. Makaylen's little white casket was closed and decorated so beautifully with flowers.

The church was filled with over 400 people who knew Adam and Mallory and came to pay their respects. In one long



pew, I sat with my 3 sons and their families (including my 4 grandchildren). It was a nice service and for me, the songs were different from what I know and were more upbeat.

A smaller group of family and close friends went out to the cemetery, Under a nice large oak tree, Makaylen's tiny casket was placed, and at the end of the graveside service, 18 balloons for each month of Maykaylen's life were released and then two white butterflies appeared and were flying around the grave!


The family returned to the church to pack up all the pictures, flowers, gifts etc. Then the family returned to their home. Unexpectedly there was a tiny rainbow over the entire neighborhood. The family felt that the 2 white butterflies and the tiny rainbow were signs sent by Makaylen. These signs are truly God winks.

Ruth In particular was one of the special speakers at the conference. Participants expressed satisfaction with the lessons learned. It is our prayers that the Lord blessed all of us and enriched us with the Holy Spirit to serve the Lord our God.

I'm still interested to share with you all. Theme: "servant leadership" 1st Peter 5:8 and 1st Timothy 3:1-16

Jesus, a man who served, looks for leadership with servant hearts. For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve and give His life as a ransom



for many [Mark 10:45] the goal of the Christian leadership is to be a servant of all when we allow the desire to become a leader: to be our focus. Servant

• We must lead by example, not by force, therefore our role as a pastor, or your choir master, mistress, church treasurer, Sunday school teacher, Children, adults, teacher, women teacher ETC. Let us lead as though we are an integrity servant leader.

An Article Written By Chad Entinge, Chad Entinge Is an associate editor-inchief with daily devotions for the deaf. Shared reasons why deaf people remain in all rich people groups in the world, that despite all advantages open for reaching out to them as Jesus did in the ministry. "The Sad Reality" is that Chad Entinge says that many deaf people do not know Jesus as their personal Lord and Savior. It has been estimated that out of 250 to 300 millions of people in the world, only 2% of them are Christians. That means 98% of the deaf people will miss out on the blessings of the eternal life with Jesus Christ in heaven. No doubt, these people are among the largest and richest people groups even in Nigeria and some states are still with the gospel. Thanks to my efforts, Taraba state has the gospel. One may be wondering why is it that so many deaf people do not know Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and savior? Here Is a story that may help us understand and within this story, one could see some obstacles to deaf learning about Christian love.

Years ago, I witnessed a deaf man, who was not a Christian. While chatting with the man, he never understood what was going on. Apparently he did not have an interpreter and no one in the church communicated with him in the only language he knew best: home language, and homemade signing language. So his impression from the church while growing up was that the pastor's main job was to make money from the church. Why did he think this way? All that the deaf man saw and clearly interpreted for himself was that the offering plates were going around with people putting their money in there. Then the plate laden with money will be given to the pastor in front of the congregation, and the pastor then with a big smile on his face talks. The pastor, as we all know has been praying for the God's blessings upon the offering but the deaf man did not understand this as he couldn't hear because of the negative experience and impression giving up the church, and he wanted nothing to do with Jesus or his church

The story above is a common experience among the deaf people. Deaf people are often abandoned, neglected and isolated even within their own church. Outside of the church the experience in their family, our peer groups, most parents abandon their deaf children because they don't know what to do and where to go for help and even with the establishment of a special school for the deaf. Most parents find a dumping ground for deaf children. Hence some parents see them as a curse, and to get rid of them. This explains why there are many deaf orphans. Not so because they lost either parents or both, but because of communication barriers. In addition, deaf people are looked down on and again, it is estimated that 9 out of 10 deaf children are born to hearing parents. Only 23% of such parents learn sign language. Even church members often pay little or no attention and don't learn sign language to communicate God's words to deaf people.

As a deaf pastor and teacher, I discover yet another challenge in reaching out to the deaf people within our reach. Which is that the English language is often the second language for the deaf. What we need to do is to continue our prayers that it opens the way for me to visit Chad deaf people this year or next year with the gospel of (Matthew 28:19) I still hope to come early next year for the ELDA Conference June 2024. I save that date.


